SUNA - NEIGHBORHOOD ASSOCIATION

The Executive Director met with Kathy Wallig and Theresa Michelson, 2 of the 3 officers, from the Southeast Urbana Neighborhood Association (SUNA) to discuss plans for the 2024 neighborhood meeting. SUNA has been organizing their annual meeting for some years now. They are a very active neighborhood association that comprises of a large section of the South East portion of Urbana. In the more recent years, SUNA has invited the leaders from the city, USD and UPD to provide updates on our activities. In our most recent years, the format is one of presentation and then questions from the audience. Past concerns by neighbors included the need for more new development along the Philo Road business corridor, reduction of crime, maintaining healthy property values and necessary street/road improvements. The UPD is requesting a change in the format for next year.

Each community leader is allotted 5 minutes to provide an annual update. The UPD update was full of great news about the proposed Health & Wellness Center, the new design for PrairiePlay, donor support at the UPF at an all-time high, Blair Park renovations, including the tennis court upgrades, the huge success of the Wandell Sculpture Garden 25 Anniversary and our on-going work to update the master plan for Weaver and Prairie Parks. While this list of impressive topics should have generated a lot of good questions, the only UPD question was about how the joint changes proposed by UPD and USD boards to reduce weekend and evening hours at the UIAC was harming the community and increasing the drownings of African Americans. This alarmist viewpoint by a single participant skewed the impact of the otherwise impressive and notable UPD topics. The same happened with other city topical presentations.

Thus, the Executive Director requested a change in the format that the SUNA meetings are conducted. Bartlett offered to provide staff and help from the other planners in the other units to try to create a more interactive and effective meeting format. Both SUNA leaders are supportive of changes to allow a better exchange of ideas, more interactive time, opportunities for "tabling exercises" to increase the amount of dialog and interaction between residents and leaders. Bartlett noted that the sheer number of SUNA participants should require a more interactive session. We have this unique opportunity to create more dialog with our residents and to help with problem solving. We all agreed to continue to meet in the coming year to plan for a new format. The UPD

staff appreciates the opportunity to work with the neighborhood leaders in making this community meeting more effective and impactful for the future.

Bartlett indicated that new planning efforts are needed for Crestview Park and that getting neighborhood input on that topic as to what is needed and who should be included in any planning for renovations would be helpful. This topic would be ideal to work on for next year. Getting direct input on what is needed at Crestview Park would help improve the meeting format and outcomes. More updates will be provided as new ideas and plans emerge.

BLAIR PARK - REICHARD FAMILY GIFT

Staff is pleased to report that our on-going work with the Reichard family to improve the Blair Park Pavilion is continuing toward a fully approved capital improvement project. UPD staff have been working with Scott, Nathan and Jon Reichard to propose a family gift opportunity at Blair Park. The entire Reichard family, multiple generations, have benefited from living near Blair Park. Their youth was filled with memories of playing and competing in tennis and other activities at the park. Their testimony of how the park played a key role in their family life is the backdrop to their family gift. The concept is to rehabilitate the existing Rourke Pavilion, whose cornerstone was laid on October 9, 1952. The older pavilion served the park for many generations. In the mid-1990s the pavilion was upgraded, mostly the restrooms, and the pavilion floor was replaced. However, that work was not a comprehensive rehabilitation effort. The pavilion is in need of a comprehensive make over.

More recently, the Reichard family has been considering helping at Blair Park. The pavilion renovation project was recommended after their keen interest in observing the Phase 1 park rehabilitation that was recently completed at Blair Park. The concept of the "Reichard Cabin" emerged. According to the Reichard family history, the pavilion was the key meeting place in the park. All of the youth met there after school to make plans for playing in the park and organizing their free time. Their love of that structure has led to staff working with the family to use their cash gift as a match for an OSLAD grant application, (due August 31, 2023), to provide a comprehensive rehabilitation and renovation of the shelter. The concept would allow for a renaming of the pavilion and to retire the Rourke name in a respectful way. This approach would both honor the past and invigorate the future.

Staff has been working in great detail with Kim Smith and Gary Burgett, Smith/Burgett Architects, and the Reichard family to make changes to the pavilion without losing the historical appeal of the structure. The design team recommends a base plan with several Alternates to allow for maximum flexibility when the bids are revealed to maximize the donor impact. The schedule of the project will follow any announcement of the next OSLAD round which is anticipated in January 2024. If awarded the OSLAD grant, then the development project would begin after the grant agreement is received and signed by the UPD. Staff recommends that the board approve the gift agreement and the grant resolution to commence the Reichard family project. Staff is grateful for the project considerations by the Reichard family.

IPARKS – SPRING 2023 MEETING

The key outcome for the spring IPARKS meeting highlighted the need for each District member to consider reviewing and accurately listing all of their assets included in the member's insurance coverage plan. It has been noted that IPARKS is very concerned that each member is carefully listing all of their critical assets to be sure adequate and necessary coverage is comprehensive. We have had recent cases in which the outcome resulted in a member agency not having coverage of items lost in a storm or other calamity. When questioned, the member identified that they did not cover the item as a way to minimize the cost of their policy. Each member agency is free to list or not list any item in their coverage. However, best practices indicate that a comprehensive listing is better, carefully considering each item listed for coverage, in order to effectively protect assets for your community. Shaving or reducing the number of items on a policy may not be helpful, especially if something bad happens to these assets.

Trustees were careful to recommend that IPARKS seek proposals for firms that could assist member agencies in itemizing all of their assets. Cost is a concern, so our hope is to provide an option for a paid service that members could consider and to provide a "checklist" of best practices so that each member could consider conducting their own inventory of items for coverage in house.

Bartlett reported that the Urbana Fire Department is working on a new approach to effectively identify all of the assets within the District to better protect our properties within the city of Urbana. UPD expects a "worksheet" approach to listing the assets. This could help serve as our new/future IPARKS template and help other member agencies in updating their inventories. More work will be shared with IPARKS as the UPD conducts our own internal audit for the Urbana Fire Department.

Business Services – Laura Orcutt, Finance Manager

Our Annual audit is in full swing, with auditors from Sikich performing fieldwork the week of July 10^{th} through July 14^{th} . The auditors worked remotely July 10^{th} and July 14^{th} , and were on-site July 11^{th} – July 13^{th} . Sikich's team worked closely with the Finance Manager and staff gathering necessary data and testing sample selections. The following several weeks were a back and forth of questions and analysis.

The Budget and Appropriation Ordinance for the fiscal year 2023-2024 was prepared with supporting materials, and the required public hearing notice ran in the News-Gazette on June 28th. Commissioners approved the Budget and Appropriation Ordinance on July 11th, and the ordinance was subsequently filed with the County Clerk on July 17th.

Human Resources – Alexandra Ivanova, Human Resources Manager

In July, the search process for the open positions of Outreach & Wellness Manager and Office Specialist concluded. The successful applicants will begin work in August. The search for an Athletic Fields Technician in the Grounds department continues, with a desired start date as soon as possible.

Development – Kelsey Beccue, Development Manager

The Urbana Parks Foundation (UPF) did not meet in July, but the various committees met to continue foundation work. The Nominating Committee convened to discuss a new applicant to the UPF board as well as strategies for continued recruitment, including the upcoming Board Match Expo hosted by the Community Foundation in September. The Events Committee also met in July to discuss the upcoming Wandell Sculpture Garden Rededication Event, as well as begin making plans for the annual Holiday Party and Annual Dinner. Fundraising activity continued as well with a couple major gift agreements for the Meadowbrook Park Playground Giving Project finalized and a new connection made with another potential major donor, putting us in a strong position heading into a public launch of the campaign at Jazz Walk. I also worked closely with the UPF Marketing Consultant to draft press release for the playground campaign and create a new brochure for the Wandell Sculpture Garden.

The Urbana Park District Advisory Committee (UPDAC) does not meet during the month of July, so I spent time completing orientation and park tours for many of our new UPDAC members who will begin in August. An UPDAC Planning Meeting has also been scheduled to review topics for the remainder of 2023 and slate new topics for the first half of 2024.

New Burglar and Fire Alarm System

The Urbana Park District was experiencing ongoing issues with the former burglar and fire security system following its vendor being purchased my larger conglomerate company. Adding and removing staff, placing the system on test, addressing false alarms, and service requests were all increasingly challenging. The former system had elements that were obsolete and would require upgrades if the district continued with that system. After consulting with a number of local agencies, Barcom Security was selected. The new system is much improved—it includes a mobile app and cloud-based interfaces that allow for more efficient staff updates, alarm monitoring, and bypassing areas. There remain two panels the district wishes to upgrade in the future to provide improved functionality, but the new system is already a significant improvement.

Blair Park Pavilion Project and Phase 2 Improvements

Planning and Project staff have been working intensively with architects, donors, and IDNR grant staff to determine how best to structure the OSLAD grant application with the donor funding available. Following a review of the pavilion project and remaining items of need/interest for the park with the Urbana Park District Advisory committee, staff prepared a final list of possible amenities for the grant. In order to not over promise what can be achieved with the funds and potential grant funds, staff have worked in a series of bid alternates for the pavilion project and the donor has offered to self-perform the restroom upgrades to help increase the likelihood of one or more alternates being awarded.

Facilities Supervisor Shane Newell

Busey Woods Boardwalk

Facility Maintenance staff are currently working on replacing rotted deck boards throughout the length of the boardwalk in Busey Woods. The replacement process is difficult to do based on removing the protective curbing along the edges and also removing the old hardware that secures the deck boards. Staff have replaced 55 deck boards and plan to inspect the boardwalk later this year to budget for additional replacements next year. The treated dimensional lumber is a special order item due to the thickness of the board and is expensive to purchase.

Grounds Notes

The short, but severe, thunderstorm we experienced on June 29th is still affecting our daily operations one month later. For the first couple weeks after the storm, at least five staff were devoted to storm clean up every day. Eventually, some of those staff had to return to mowing, but the clean-up continues with at least two to three people working on it each day. All together we lost eight trees, either by blowing over or being damaged so badly that we had to remove them. This is in addition to the countless trees that were damaged, but are still standing.

Grant Goff, our Athletic Fields Technician, worked his last day on July 14th, and we are currently searching for his replacement. Fortunately, some of our seasonal staff will be staying with us past the middle of August, so we should have enough bodies to cover the gap until that person is hired.

This spring we created a mobile flower bed, made out of a 2' x 4' horse tank. Georgena planted it with annuals, and the plan is to move it periodically from park to park, to add a little color to places that don't have elaborate flower beds. It was first placed on the south side of Prairie, facing Washington, and is currently in the southeast section of South Ridge. In the middle of August, it will be moved again.

A large oak tree had fallen and had taken out two swing bays but we were fortunate that the majority of the tree fell between the 2 to 5 and the 5 to 12 sections of the playground and didn't do any damage to them. Parts for the two swing bays are ordered and waiting for delivery. The parts came to a little over \$6,000 dollars. We have also have been working on a few other playgrounds that need replacement parts due to wear and tear or vandalism. It has taken a significant amount of time to get parts ordered and received. It seems to get harder to get vendors to respond to emails or phone calls. After this last round of parts and getting the Crystal Lake Park playground back to normal we should be up to date on our playground repairs.

Signs

I have been rehabbing some our park signs starting at Dog Park/Meadowbrook. I power wash and repaint/stain them. I would like to freshen up all of the wooden signs at Meadowbrook prior to the Wandell Sculpture Garden 25th anniversary celebration this fall.

PLANNING & OPERATIONS REPORT

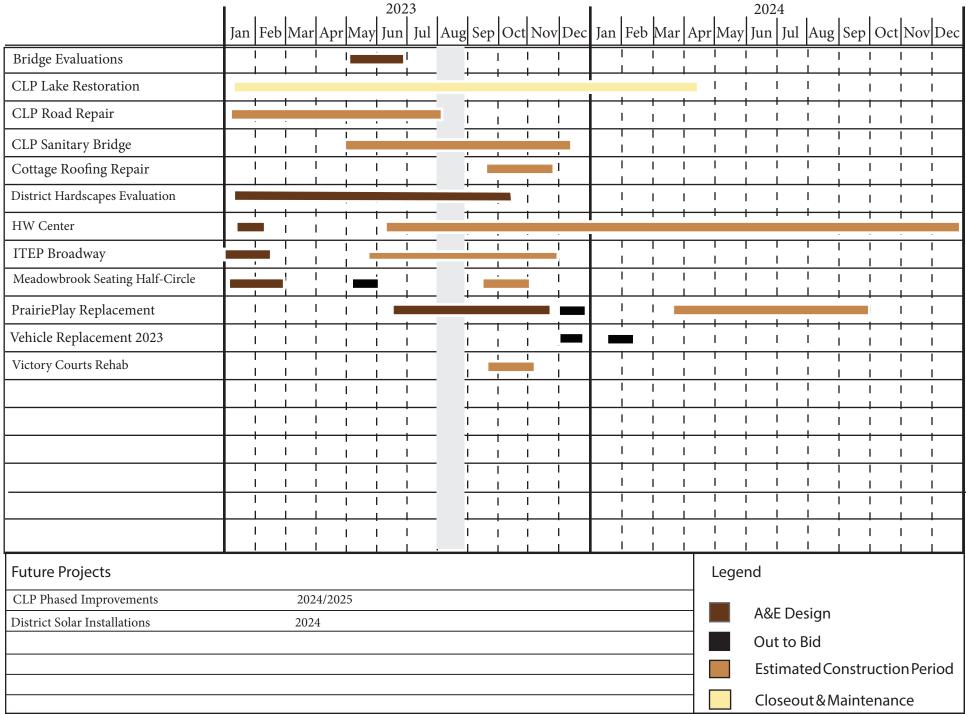
Aquatics Facilities Supervisor Joseph Schmidt UIAC

The Urbana Indoor Aquatic Center competition pool was filled and prepared for upcoming swim team use. The new tiger slide and landing pad were installed in the activity pool. Two new fan motors were installed in the PoolPak dehumidification unit. A replacement variable frequency drive was ordered for the activity pool filter pump. A replacement heater was installed for the activity pool. Replacement starting block platforms were ordered. UPD staff trained USD staff on how to fill and filter pools. Some shower stalls were painted. Deep cleaning of the facility is ongoing.

CLPFAC

The Crystal Lake Park Family Aquatic Center held a Nadiators sectional swim meet. New deck furniture was delivered and put into service. The locker rooms were deep cleaned. Staff completed some touch-up painting in the guard office. Maintenance staff spent many hours troubleshooting equipment problems and learning about how to diagnose electrical problems in the chemical controllers.

Community

Community Program Manager Janet Soesbe — This was one of the most unusual summers for Neighborhood Nights concerts. For AMBUCS Park, we used the rain date and the Victory Park concert had both dates completely canceled. This was the first time that an outdoor concert was postponed due to a dangerous Air Quality Index. According to that day's News-Gazette, "The Champaign Urbana Public Health Districts said Champaign County's Air Quality Index (AQI) is at 231, meaning all individuals should take precautions and the risk of health effects is increased for everyone." It was decided to postpone to the following night, but on that Thursday afternoon, the area had a very damaging derecho blow through and there were too many limbs down in the sodden park. It wasn't possible to get it cleaned up in time for a concert, so we cancelled all together. The final challenge for our concert series was that our last band broke up one week before their show due to illness in their extended family. Luckily, they found a (terrific) replacement! Unfortunately, that last concert was held with a heat index of 102° so our attendance was about 2/3 of our usual crowd at Meadowbrook. The Elderly Brothers filled in for Nickel and Dimes. They played country and country rock classics and did a fantastic job despite the heat. We will definitely ask them back! This year, in addition to the Urbana Parks Foundation at all concerts, the City of Urbana was at all of the concerts but the last one, and RPC Early Childhood had a table at all but two of the concerts. The Urbana Free Library came to Blair Park's concert, Uniting Pride came to AMBUCS Park, and our presenting sponsor, The Music Shoppe, came to two of the concerts and brought instruments for the kids to check out. We really appreciated it!

Community Program Assistant, Katherine Bickers (Dixon) — The Community Program Assistant has worked on planning for the Fall SPLASH Program and getting staff organized and lined up. She has also working on camp duties such as communicating with families, ordering supplies, organizing staff time off, end of the year field trips, camp photos, and assisting in planning week 10 public arts week. We will be creating a "school of fish" garden art installation for Phillips as well as art work for the Wandell Sculpture Garden celebration. Campers especially enjoyed learning to sew during week 8 of art camp.







Recreation Office Manager, Heather Britsky – The Youth Summer Theatre's production of Beauty and the Beast was the final weekend of July. All four shows sold out the week before performances! We have never had a show sell out with pre-purchased tickets, so having all four performances require a waitlist was exceptionally exciting. There were approximately 1,300 seats filled to watch these 89 youth perform. The Recreation Office Manager was at Parkland theatre for all four shows; running the box office, assisting with concessions, and handling a multitude of miscellaneous backstage tasks.



Interviews for the Office Specialist I position were held the second week of July. Latrice Miller, who has been a manager at both Urbana Indoor Aquatic Center and Crystal Lake Park Family Aquatic Center for the past several years, accepted the position with a start date of August 7th.

Environmental

Environmental Program Manager, Savannah Donovan – This month the manager started soliciting program and activity proposals for *Climate Action Week* (CAW), October 1-8, 2023. All programs/activities will include some element of local or regional climate change education, inspiration, or action. Proposals for public engagement could include, but are not limited to:

- Workshops / hands-on programs
- Volunteer stewardship opportunities (cleanups, gardening, invasives removal, etc.)
- Visual / performance art
- Educational presentations (in person or over Zoom)
- Themed hikes
- Social meet-ups
- Collections / swaps for recyclable or reusable items
- Voter registrations

In its first year in 2022, nearly 600 people participated in CAW programs and events with help from more than 20 community partners. Our goal in this second year is to double participation from last year! We aim to do this by offering a wide variety of experiences and program topics for people of all demographics. CAW will take place all over the Urbana-Champaign community, but the hub will be located at Crystal Lake Park in Urbana, and some programs may be conducted through Zoom. The manager has designated a few major dates so far:

- Sun, Oct. 1 Fri, Oct. 6: Free public programs and stewardship opportunities
- **Friday, Oct. 6 (evening):** *Green Ball*—This will be a semi-formal affair with a theme of upcycling and anti-fast-fashion. This may end up being a ticketed event with live music, light hors d'oeuvres, and hopefully a "trashion show." Location and final details TBD.
- Sat, Oct. 7, 1-4pm: Main event @ Crystal Lake Park; free; all ages; food and live music
- Sun, Oct. 8, 1-4pm: Rain Date for main event

Environmental Public Program Coordinator, David Subers – This month the coordinator has been working on providing information to the public about dead and fallen trees in Busey Woods and other parks and natural areas. We have received a fair number of inquiries about the amount of deadfall currently in Busey Woods, most of which is a long-term result of the emerald ash borer (EAB) beetle. In addition to emails and verbal conversations, the coordinator wrote an article for the News-Gazette about EAB, its effect on our local area, and decisions the park district has made regarding its ash trees. Additionally, the coordinator has also organized and facilitated over 15 live animal and fishing programs this month with Nature Camp and other local groups.

Environmental Education Coordinator, Chelsea Prahl — The coordinator spent time this month implementing Camp FRESH (Future Responsible Environmental Stewardship Heroes). Camp FRESH, formerly known as Teen Adventure Camp (2018), is an immersive, experiential learning opportunity available to 12- to 15-year-olds. This camp consisted of three weeklong sessions from July 10-28, running each weekday from 8am-3pm. Thirty-seven (37) campers were registered for Camp FRESH this summer over the course of the three weeks, compared to 29 campers in 2022. Feedback from Camp FRESH has been positive so far. Formal surveys are sent to campers' adults after each session. Examples of activities and collaborating organizations involved in Camp FRESH this summer included:



- Cooking brunch and lunch alongside the U of I Dining services at the James Room Kitchen
- Designing mini sculptures with The Urbana Free Library to showcase at the Crystal Lake Park Art Fair
- Escaping a room at CU Adventures in Time and Space

 Making blankets to donate to the Champaign County Humane Society and touring the facility

- Watched a show at the Staerkel Planetarium
- Paddle boating and fishing at Crystal Lake Park
- Climbing at Urbana Boulders
- Tour and veggie tasting at Sola Gratia Farm
- Visiting the U of I Center for Innovation in Teaching & Learning Studio







Environmental Office Manager, Nicole Hilberg— The office manager spent time this month working with AT&T to clarify UPD's monthly charges, remove any unused hardware or plans, and enable an iPad with cellular data for environmental programs; specifically Nature Day Camp. The office manager learned we are experiencing hotspot issues during Nature Day Camp check-in/out at the UPDAC Learning Pavilion because we are exceeding the 10GB data capacity very early in the billing cycle. After the 10GB cap is reached, the hotspot restricts all sending and receiving for the rest of the billing cycle down to 0.5GB which is not a functional amount of data. A new, cellular-data-enabled iPad was purchased and added to the monthly plan with no monthly data cap. Nature Camp check-in and check-out at the UPDAC Learning Pavilion began running smoothly, without staff having to use their personal cell phone data plans. Many staff and customers expressed relief at the ease and reliability of the new system.

DISTRICT

I. Statement of Situation

The Saline Branch Drainage District placed a stop work order on the ITEP grant bridge project over concerns regarding the new bridge's elevation and design. Fehr-Graham Engineering acknowledged they had overlooked including the Drainage District in the plan review and noted the bridge was designed so that the lowest portion of the bridge (low chord) was the same elevation as the adjacent City of Urbana vehicular bridge on Broadway Ave. The Drainage District remained concerned that the Urbana Park District's type of bridge would not withstand flooding events as well as the City of Urbana bridge does.

II. Statement of work

Staff worked with Fehr-Graham, the Drainage District, and Drainage District engineer Berns Clancy and Associates to review concerns and were able to raise the bridge by approximately five inches so the low chord will be at an elevation of 704.0 feet or higher. The Drainage District remained concerned about the elevation of the bridge so staff also worked with legal counsel for both the Drainage District and the Park District to update the Drainage District's standard permit agreement for the bridge project. That updated agreement is provided for Board review and approval.

III. Recommendation

Staff recommends that the Board approve the agreement with the Saline Branch Drainage District.

PERMIT AGREEMENT FOR PEDESTRIAN BRIDGE CRYSTAL LAKE PARK

NOW COMES, Saline Branch Drainage District in the County of Champaign and State of Illinois (hereinafter referred to as "Drainage District"), by and through its duly authorized Commissioners, and Urbana Park District, Urbana, Illinois, (hereinafter referred to as "Park District"), by and through its duly authorized Commissioners, and the parties agree as follows:

- 1. That the Drainage District has constructed and presently maintains a drainage system consisting of open ditches stream channels and tile drains for the purpose of providing a drainage outlet for the lands and other properties situated within the Drainage District boundaries, including some such facilities that are situated within the boundaries of the Park District's Crystal Lake Park ("CLP") as more particularly identified on the map attached to and incorporated into this Agreement as Exhibit A.
- 2. That the Drainage District has a drainage right-of-way along its drainage system, including within the boundaries of CLP, which right-of-way constitutes an easement for drainage purposes;
- 3. That Park District proposes to construct certain improvements, using its own staff and/or a general contractor, the same being a steel truss pedestrian bridge (the "Bridge") over the Drainage District's Saline Branch Drainage Ditch (the "Ditch") within the boundaries of CLP approximately 50 feet West of the City of Urbana's Broadway Avenue bridge as indicated on Exhibit A.
- 4. That the Park District and/or its general contractor shall construct the Bridge in a good and workmanlike manner in accordance with the Engineering Plans and Specifications entitled Crystal Lake Park Shared Use Path, Urbana Park District, prepared by Fehr Graham Engineers, dated October 6, 2022 and attached hereto and incorporated herein as Exhibit B (the "Plans"), except as modified pursuant to Paragraph 8 of this Agreement.
- 5. That the Drainage District believes that the Bridge has not been adequately designed to protect it from submergence during large flood events and further represents a potential for significant blockage of stream flow due to collection of waterborne debris and vegetation trash during large flood events. The Drainage District further believes that the Bridge represents a significant hazard that could result in the flooding of and flood damage to adjacent public and private property.

- 6. That Drainage District nevertheless agrees to allow construction of the Bridge in the manner generally as set forth in Exhibit B, except as modified pursuant to Paragraph 8 of this Agreement.
- 7. That Park District agrees to construct the Bridge in accordance with the Plans, and no material change shall be made from the Plans without the express written consent of Drainage District.
- 8. That the design and construction of the Bridge as provided in the Plans has been altered so that the lowest portion of the Bridge (low chord) trusses are at an elevation of 704.0 feet (NAVD-88) or higher.
- 9. That Park District acknowledges that for flood events of approximately the 10-year return period and greater, portions of the Bridge are projected by the Park District project engineer to be submerged below the anticipated high water surface elevation of flow within the Ditch.
- 10. That Park District acknowledges that for flood events of approximately the 100-year return period and greater the low chord of the Bridge is projected by the Park District project engineer to be submerged approximately 2.5 feet below the anticipated high water surface elevation of flow within the Ditch.
- 11. That Park District shall provide a copy of this Agreement to the general contractor participating in construction of the Bridge.
- 12. That Park District agrees to cooperate in good faith with Drainage District regarding and shall be responsible for the repair and/or restoration of ancillary damages to the Ditch, whether discovered during or after construction of the Bridge, that are determined to have been caused by construction of the Bridge. The repairs and/or restoration of the Ditch shall be at the Park District's own cost and/or expense and Park District agrees to complete such repair and/or restoration so as to return the affected area to its preconstruction condition.
- 13. That Park District agrees to be solely responsible for the construction, operation and maintenance of the Bridge and assumes the risks and responsibilities associated with said construction, operation, and maintenance.
- 14. That Park District shall be responsible for removal of waterborne vegetative trash and debris that may accumulate in the Ditch within the 200 feet upstream (westward) and/or 200 feet downstream (eastward) of said Bridge. Park District shall within 24 hours of the occurrence of a significant flood event inspect the Bridge and the Ditch, both upstream and downstream portions thereof, and shall remove accumulated waterborne vegetative trash and debris therefrom within 48 hours thereafter or within such time beyond 48 hours as is allowed by Drainage District. The waterborne vegetative trash and debris removal shall be at Park District's sole cost and expense.

- 15. That Park District agrees to promptly restore excavated trenches, replace surface vegetation with like and kind, and to repair any settlement of trenches, to restore the Drainage District right-of-way to its pre-construction condition.
- 16. That in the event the Drainage District discovers damage to the Ditch caused by improper construction, maintenance and/or operation of the Bridge, the Drainage District shall contact Park District to perform the Drainage District specified repairs to the Ditch. The Park District agrees to make repairs as soon as practicable, but in any event not later than 30 days after contacted by the Drainage District, or such reasonably extended period approved by the Drainage District, provided the Park District has begun and continues diligently performing such repairs. If Park District should fail to diligently perform such repairs, then Drainage District may make the repairs and submit the bill for the cost of the repairs to Park District, and upon receipt of such a bill Park District agrees to pay the same within thirty (30) days.
- 17. That Park District may need to perform non-emergency work upon the Bridge within the Drainage District right of way. The Park District will notify the Drainage District fifteen (15) days in advance of such work and will be responsible for the repair of any damage to the Ditch that results from said work at Park District's sole cost and expense.
- 18. That in cases of future emergency repair work upon the Bridge, Park District agrees to immediately notify the Drainage District about the emergency work being performed.
- 19. That this Agreement does not include the future installation or construction of additional improvements and/or facilities by Park District within the Drainage District's right-of-way.
- 20. That in all cases of performing non-emergency maintenance and/or repair work to Drainage District improvements and/or facilities at or near the Bridge, the Drainage District agrees to notify Park District fifteen (15) days in advance of such non-emergency work so that Park District may have a representative present at the time such work is conducted. The Drainage District also agrees to give Park District a reasonable opportunity to inspect and examine all such work near the Bridge to determine that no damage has been caused to the same. The Drainage District shall be responsible for the reasonable costs of repair and/or restoration of the Bridge to its pre-work condition where it is determined, whether during or after such work is completed, that damage to the Bridge has been caused by the Drainage District's work. Subject to reimbursement of such costs by the Drainage District, the Park District shall be responsible for completion of such repair and/or restoration.
- 21. That Park District represents that it has obtained construction permits from all local, state, and federal regulatory agencies governing the construction of said Bridge improvements and that said improvements will be constructed in accordance with the applicable regulations and requirements of said governmental agencies.

- 22. That in the event the Bridge is determined to interfere with the necessary future repair, maintenance and or realignment of the Ditch, Park District will pay the additional cost or expense incurred by the Drainage District in connection with the repair, maintenance, alteration, and/or realignment of the Ditch interfered with, so as to avoid the Bridge. Alternatively, Park District agrees that in the event of a conflict between the Bridge and future Drainage District construction activities or facilities, Park District at its exclusive option and cost may relocate the Bridge to avoid said conflict in lieu of the cost reimbursement outlined above.
- 23. That Park District shall be responsible for all additional Commissioners' fees the Drainage District's Attorneys' fees, Court costs, construction costs, Drainage District Engineer's fees, and all other costs incurred by the Drainage District as a result of the failure of Park District to comply with the terms of this Agreement, arising from any successful demand or action of the Drainage District to enforce any of the terms of this Agreement.
- 24. That Park District agrees to defend the Drainage District, its officers and agents from any and all demands, claims, and/or legal actions, arising out of the improper or negligent construction, maintenance, and/or operation of the Bridge including claims of flooding damage to public or private property. Park District agrees to pay all Commissioners' fees, District Engineer's fees, Attorney's fees, other expenses and court costs incurred by the Drainage District as a result of any demand, claim, or legal action made or brought as a result of improper or negligent construction, maintenance, and/or operation of the Bridge. Park District agrees to pay all settlements and/or judgment resulting from any demand, claim, or legal action made or brought as a result of the negligent construction, maintenance, and/or operation of the Bridge.
- 25. That Park District agrees to pay all costs incurred by the District in entering into this Agreement, including court costs, publication fees, Commissioners' fees, Engineer's fees, and Attorneys' fees, which as of the execution of this Agreement are estimated to be ten thousand dollars (\$10,000).
- 26. That Park District and Drainage District agree that at such time as the City of Urbana substantially alters or replaces the roadway bridge for Broadway Avenue, Park District shall take such actions as are reasonably necessary to include construction of a multi- purpose pedestrian pathway as an integral element of the altered or replaced Broadway Avenue bridge. Further, at such time that the Broadway Avenue bridge is altered or replaced, the Park District shall remove the Bridge from the Drainage District's right-of-way and shall restore the Ditch in a manner as directed by Drainage District. It is understood that the ultimate decision about future modifications of the Broadway Avenue roadway bridge falls under the jurisdiction of the City of Urbana.

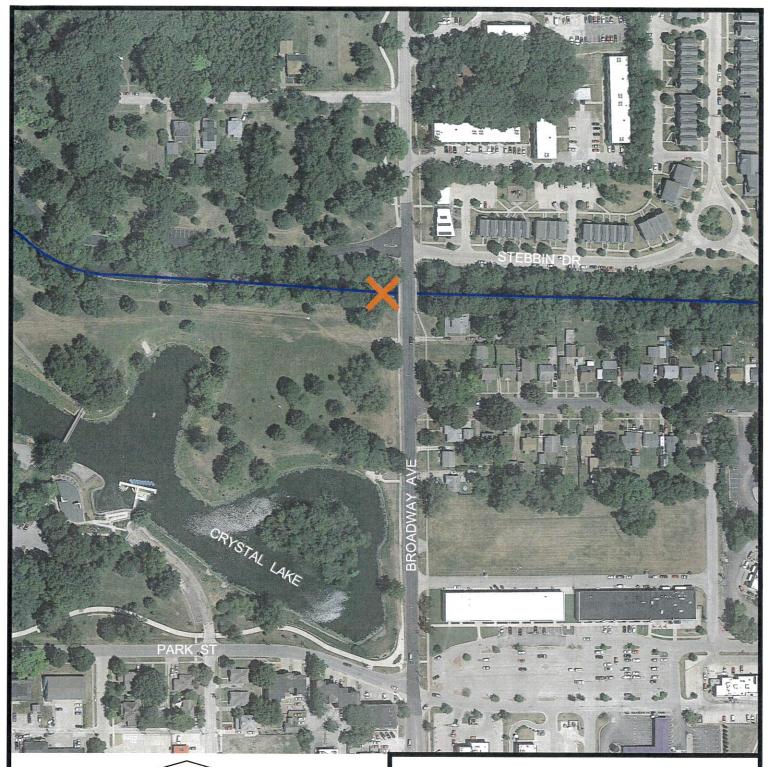
- 27. That it is understood and agreed that the provisions of this Agreement cannot be changed in any regard except in writing signed by authorized representatives of both parties to this Agreement.
- 28. This Agreement shall be governed by the laws of the State of Illinois, and venue for any action related to this Agreement shall lie in the state courts located in Champaign County, Illinois.
- 29. This Agreement constitutes the entire agreement and understanding between the parties and shall be binding on and inure to the benefit of the successors, transferees in title, and permitted assignees of the respective parties.
- 30. Consent or approval of the parties, where required, shall not be unreasonably withheld, delayed, or conditioned. If any provision of this Agreement is deemed invalid or unenforceable, the remainder of this Agreement shall remain in force and to the fullest extent as permitted by law.
- 31. The signatories below represent and acknowledge they have full and binding legal authority to execute this Agreement on behalf of the parties below.
- 32. This Agreement shall be submitted to the Circuit Court of the Sixth Judicial Circuit, Champaign County, Illinois, for judicial approval, and upon approval thereof shall be binding upon the parties hereto, their successors and assigns.
- 33. That this Agreement has been executed in triplicate, each of which shall be considered an original.

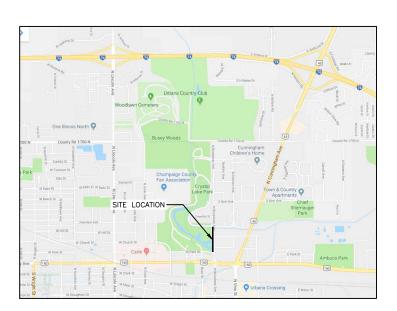

- 6. IN CASE OF CONFLICT BETWEEN THE ABOVE MENTIONED SPECIFICATIONS, THE ENGINEER SHALL DETERMINE WHICH OF THE SPECIFICATIONS SHALL GOVERN. THE ENGINEER'S DECISION SHALL BE FINAL AND NO ADDITIONAL COMPENSATION SHALL BE AWARDED UNLESS APPROVED BY THE ENGINEER.
- THE PROPOSED IMPROVEMENTS MUST BE CONSTRUCTED IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE ENGINEERING PLANS AS APPROVED BY THE OWNER. IMPROVEMENT REPRESENTATIONS AS SHOWN ON THESE PLANS, ARE AS ACCURATE AS POSSIBLE FROM THE INFORMATION AVAILABLE. HOWEVER SOME FIELD REVISIONS MAY BE REQUIRED TO ACCOMMODATE UNFORESEEN CIRCUMSTANCES — THE ENGINEER SHALL BE ADVISED OF ANY NECESSARY REVISIONS WITH SUFFICIENT LEAD TIME ALLOWED TO PROPERLY CONSIDER AND ACT UPON SAID REQUESTS. PROPER CONSTRUCTION TECHNIQUES MUST BE FOLLOWED IN CONSTRUCTING THOSE IMPROVEMENTS AS DETAILED IN THIS ENGINEERING PLAN.
- 8. THE ENGINEER SHALL HAVE THE AUTHORITY TO INSPECT, APPROVE OR REJECT THE WORKMANSHIP AND/OR MATERIALS WHICH GO TO MAKE UP IMPROVEMENTS AS DETAILED IN THESE PLANS AND SPECIFICATIONS.
- 9. GENERAL SAFETY PROVISION: TO PROVIDE DRIVERS WITH SAFE TRAVEL CONDITIONS DURING THE CONSTRUCTION PROJECT AND TO PROVIDE SAFE WORKING CONDITIONS FOR ALL EMPLOYEES, THE RULES, REGULATIONS, AND CONDITIONS STATED

 BELOW WILL PREVAIL FOR THE DURATION OF THIS CONTRACT. ANY EMPLOYEE OF THE CONTRACTOR OR HIS

 SUBCONTRACTORS WHO REFUSES TO COMPLY WITH THESE GENERAL SAFETY PROVISIONS SHALL BE REMOVED FROM THE JOB SITE IN ACCORDANCE WITH STATE AND LOCAL REQUIREMENTS. THE CONTRACTOR AND ANY SUBCONTRACTORS RETAINED BY HIM SHALL COMPLY WITH THE STATE AND FEDERAL REQUIREMENTS OF THE OCCUPATIONAL SAFETY AND HEALTH ACT OF 1970 (OSHA), JULY 1, 1987 AS IT RELATES TO CONTRACTOR'S OPERATIONS.
- 10. THE CONTRACTOR SHALL COMPLY WITH ALL STATE REGULATIONS REGARDING AIR, WATER, AND NOISE POLLUTION. THE CONTRACTOR WILL NOT BE ALLOWED TO BUILD FIRES ON THE SITE.
- 11. THE SCALE SHOWN ON THE DRAWINGS APPLIES ONLY TO THE FULL SIZE PLANS NOT THE REDUCED SIZE PLANS.
- 12. IT SHALL BE THE CONTRACTOR'S RESPONSIBILITY TO MAINTAIN DRAINAGE FLOWS AT ALL TIMES DURING THE PERFORMANCE OF THE WORK. METHODS USED BY THE CONTRACTOR SHALL BE SUBJECT TO THE APPROVAL OF THE ENGINEER. COST OF MAINTAINING DRAINAGE FLOWS SHALL BE INCIDENTAL TO THE CONTRACT.
- 13. WHERE SECTION OR SUBSECTION MONUMENTS ARE ENCOUNTERED, THE ENGINEER SHALL BE NOTIFIED BEFORE SUCH MONUMENTS ARE REMOVED OR DISTURBED. THE CONTRACTOR SHALL PROTECT AND CAREFULLY PRESERVE ALL PROPERTY MARKERS, MONUMENTS AND RIGHT—OF—WAY PINS UNTIL THE OWNER, AND AUTHORIZED SURVEYOR, OR AGENT HAS WITNESSED OR OTHERWISE REFERENCED THEIR LOCATION. THE CONTRACTOR SHALL BE RESPONSIBLE FOR HAVING AN AUTHORIZED SURVEYOR RE-ESTABLISH ANY SECTION OR SUBSECTION MONUMENTS DESTROYED BY HIS OPERATIONS. REPLACEMENT OF MONUMENTS WILL BE DETERMINED BY THE ENGINEER
- 14. THE CONTRACTOR SHALL REMOVE, STORE, AND RELOCATE TO THE SATISFACTION OF THE ENGINEER ALL EXISTING SIGNAGE IN ACCORDANCE WITH STATE AND LOCAL REQUIREMENTS, AND CONSIDER THIS AS INCIDENTAL TO THE CONTRACT.
- 15. OUTSIDE THE EXISTING RIGHT-OF-WAY, THE CONTRACTOR SHALL USE CARE IN GRADING OR EXCAVATION NEAR ANY AND ALL EXISTING SIGNS OUTSIDE THE RIGHT-OF-WAY. ANY SIGNS REMOVED FOR CONSTRUCTION PURPOSES SHALL BE CAREFULLY REMOVED AND RE-ERECTED BY THE CONTRACTOR AT A LOCATION NEAREST TO THE ORIGINAL LOCATION, OR AT A LOCATION DETERMINED BY THE ENGINEER IN THE FIELD. REMOVAL AND RE-ERECTED SIGNS AND ANY DAMAGE DONE TO EXISTING SIGNS BY THE CONTRACTOR'S OPERATIONS SHALL BE REPAIRED OR REPLACED AT NO ADDITIONAL EXPENSE TO THE OWNER.
- 16. ALL ITEMS SHALL INCLUDE ALL THE NECESSARY MATERIALS AND LABOR TO COMPLETE THE ITEM IN PLACE. MATERIALS AND LABOR NOT SPECIFICALLY IDENTIFIED SHALL BE CONSIDERED INCIDENTAL TO THE PROJECT.
- 17. AT THE END OF EACH DAY, THE CONTRACTOR SHALL SECURE THE CONSTRUCTION WORK ZONE FROM POTENTIAL INTRUDERS.
- 18. THE CONTRACTOR SHALL FIELD VERIEY THE FLEVATIONS OF THE BENCHMARKS PRIOR TO COMMENCING WORK. CONTRACTOR SHALL ALSO FIELD VERIFY LOCATION, ELEVATION AND SIZE OF EXISTING UTILITIES, AND VERIFY PAVEMENT ELEVATIONS WHERE MATCHING INTO EXISTING WORK. THE CONTRACTOR SHALL FIELD VERIFY HORIZONTAL CONTROL BY REFERENCING SHOWN COORDINATES TO KNOWN PROPERTY LINES. NOTIFY ENGINEER OF DISCREPANCIES IN EITHER VERTICAL OR HORIZONTAL CONTROL PRIOR TO PROCEEDING WITH WORK.
- 19. THE CONTRACTOR SHALL CONTACT THE ENGINEER OF ANY ERRORS OR DISCREPANCIES WHICH MAY BE SUSPECTED IN LINES AND GRADES, AND SHALL NOT PROCEED WITH THE WORK UNTIL ALL LINES AND GRADES WHICH ARE BELIEVED TO BE IN ERROR HAVE BEEN VERIFIED OR CORRECTED BY THE ENGINEER OR HIS REPRESENTATIVE.
- 20. THE ENGINEER AND OWNER ARE NOT RESPONSIBLE FOR THE CONSTRUCTION MEANS, METHODS, TECHNIQUES, SEQUENCE OR PROCEDURES, TIME OF PERFORMANCE, PROGRAMS OR ANY SAFETY PRECAUTIONS USED BY THE CONTRACTOR. THE CONTRACTOR IS SOLELY RESPONSIBLE FOR EXECUTION OF THEIR WORK IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE CONTRACT DOCUMENTS
- 21. ALL ITEMS TO BE REMOVED AND NOT DEFINED AS A PAY ITEM SHALL BE CONSIDERED INCIDENTAL TO THE PROJECT.
- 22. ALL EXCESS EARTH EXCAVATION, EXCESS MATERIALS, OR OTHER REMOVED ITEMS SHALL BE HAULED OFF-SITE AT THE CONTRACTOR'S EXPENSE, UNLESS OTHERWISE APPROVED BY THE OWNER.
- 23. THIS WORK SHALL BE IN ACCORDANCE WITH SECTION 201 OF THE ILLINOIS DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION'S "STANDARD SPECIFICATIONS FOR ROAD AND BRIDGE CONSTRUCTION, CURRENT EDITION. THE CONTRACTOR SHALL REMOVE AND DISPOSE OF ALL OBSTRUCTIONS, TREES, DEBRIS AND BRUSH AS DESIGNATED BY THE OWNER AND AS INDICATED ON THE PLANS. ALL MATERIALS SHALL BE DISPOSED OF AT THE CONTRACTOR'S EXPENSE. DURING CONSTRUCTION, CARE SHALL BE TAKEN TO MINIMIZE DAMAGE TO THE EXISTING TREES AND LANDSCAPING. ONLY THOSE ITEMS DESIGNATED BY THE OWNER SHALL
- 24. ALL ROADWAY REMOVAL ITEMS SHALL CONFORM TO THE ILLINOIS DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION'S "STANDARE SPECIFICATIONS FOR ROAD AND BRIDGE CONSTRUCTION", CURRENT EDITION. ALL JOINTS BETWEEN THE PORTION REMOVED AND THAT LEFT IN PLACE SHALL BE SAWED TO SUCH A DEPTH THAT A CLEAN, NEAT EDGE WILL RESULT WITH NO SPALLING TO THE REMAINING PORTION. THE COST OF SAWING SHALL BE CONSIDERED INCIDENTAL TO THE CONTRACT. ADDITIONAL SAWING OR RE-SAWING MAY BE REQUIRED AS DIRECTED BY THE ENGINEER WITH NO ADDITIONAL COMPENSATION BEING ALLOWED. THE COST OF SAWCUTTING THE EXISTING PAVEMENT SHALL NOT BE PAID FOR SEPARATELY, BUT SHALL BE CONSIDERED INCIDENTAL TO THE CONTRACT.

GENERAL NOTES

- 25. WHEN ARTIFICIAL LIGHTING IS UTILIZED DURING NIGHT OPERATIONS, THE CONTRACTOR SHALL EXERCISE UTMOST PRECAUTIONS IN PREVENTING ADVERSE VISIBILITY TO THE MOTORING PUBLIC, AS WELL AS ADJOINING RESIDENTIAL AREAS.
- 26. THE CONTRACTOR IS REQUIRED TO STAY WITHIN THE NOTED PROPERTY BOUNDARIES RIGHT-OF-WAY AND EASEMENTS AS SHOWN IN THE PLANS. ANY ADDITIONAL EASEMENTS SHALL BE SECURED BY THE CONTRACTOR AT NO EXTRA COST.
- 27. ANY AREAS DAMAGED OR DISTURBED DURING THE PROJECT AS A DIRECT OR INDIRECT RESULT OF CONTRACTOR OPERATIONS, SHALL BE RESTORED TO A CONDITION EQUAL TO OR BETTER THAN THE ORIGINAL CONDITION. THE COST OF SAID RESTORATION OR REPAIR SHALL BE BORNE TOTALLY BY THE CONTRACTOR, WITH NO EXTRA COMPENSATION BEING AWARDED UNDER THIS CONTRACT. THE RESPONSIBILITY FOR THE REPAIR OR REPLACEMENT OF ANY UTILITY, STRUCTURE, AWARDED UNITED HIS CONTRACT. THE RESPONSIBILITY FOR THE REPAIR OR REPLACEMENT OF ANY UTILITY, STRUCTURE, LANDSCAPING, ETC., DAMAGED OR DESTROYED BY THE CONTRACTOR DURING MOBILIZATION OR CONSTRUCTION SHALL BE BORNE SOLELY BY THE CONTRACTOR, WITH NO EXPENSE BEING CHARGED TO THE ENGINEER OR OWNER. PRIOR TO ACCEPTANCE OF THIS REPAIR OR REPLACEMENT, THE CONTRACTOR SHALL PRESENT THE OWNER WITH A "SIGNOFF LETTER", SIGNED BY A RESPONSIBLE OFFICIAL OF THE OWNER OF THE DAMAGED UTILITY STATING THAT THE REPAIR OR REPLACEMENT

CONSTRUCTION STAKING

THE CONTRACTOR SHALL BE RESPONSIBLE FOR STAKING THE PROPOSED IMPROVEMENTS AND SHALL INCLUDE THE COST
OF STAKING IN THEIR QUOTE. CONTROL POINTS ARE INDICATED ON THE PLANS.

EROSION CONTROL NOTES

- 1. UNLESS OTHERWISE SPECIFIED, ALL EROSION AND SEDIMENT CONTROL MEASURES AND THEIR MAINTENANCE, CLEARING AND REMOVAL SHALL BE CONSIDERED INCIDENTAL TO CONSTRUCTION.
- 2. THIS WORK SHALL CONFORM TO THE APPLICABLE STANDARDS FROM THE URBANA EROSION CONTROL STANDARDS, THE ILLINOIS DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION STANDARD SPECIFICATION, CURRENT EDITION, THE PROJECT SPECIFICATIONS, AND THE APPROPRIATE DETAILS.
- 3. A NOTICE OF INTENT (NOI) AND A STORM WATER POLLUTION PREVENTION PLAN (SWPPP) WILL BE COMPLETED AND SUBMITTED TO THE ILLINOIS EPA BY THE OWNER PRIOR TO CONSTRUCTION.
- 4. THE SWPPP SHALL BE CONSIDERED PART OF THE CONTRACT DOCUMENTS AND WILL BE AVAILABLE FOR REVIEW DURING THE
- 5. A COPY OF THE SWPPP WILL BE PROVIDED TO THE SUCCESSFUL BIDDER. THE CONTRACTOR SHALL MAINTAIN ONE COPY OF THE SWPPP AT THE CONSTRUCTION SITE AT ALL TIMES DURING WORKING HOURS FROM THE DATE OF PROJECT INITIATION TO THE DATE OF FINAL STABILIZATION.
- 6. THE CONTRACTOR SHALL LEGIBLY MARK ANY CHANGES OR REVISIONS IMPLEMENTED TO THE SWPPP. AT COMPLETION OF THE PROJECT, THE CONTRACTOR SHALL DELIVER THE SWPPP (INCLUDING ALL REVISIONS, RECORDS, AND INSPECTION REPORTS) TO THE OWNER.
- 7. THE GENERAL CONTRACTOR AND ANY SUBCONTRACTOR RESPONSIBLE FOR SEDIMENT AND EROSION CONTROL MEASURES OR CONSTRUCTION ACTIVITIES THAT DISTURB SITE SOIL WILL BE REQUIRED TO CERTIFY THE SWPPP BEFORE A NOTICE TO
- 8. A COPY OF THE LETTER OF NOTIFICATION OF COVERAGE, AND THE GENERAL NPDES PERMIT NO. ILR10 MUST BE POSTED IN A PROMINENT PLACE FOR PUBLIC VIEWING AT THE CONSTRUCTION SITE BY THE GENERAL CONTRACTOR.
- THE CONTRACTOR SHALL IMPLEMENT THE EROSION AND SEDIMENT CONTROL MEASURES AS INDICATED ON THESE EROSION CONTROL PLANS AND IN THE SWPPP BEFORE CONSTRUCTION BEGINS.
- 10. THE CONTROLS SHALL BE INSTALLED AS DETAILED AND WHERE INDICATED ON THE EROSION CONTROL PLAN SHEETS AND AS DIRECTED BY THE INSPECTOR.
- 11. SITE ACTIVITIES SHOULD ENSURE THAT EXISTING VEGETATION IS PRESERVED WHERE PRACTICABLE
- 12. EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN THE SWPPP, DISTURBED PORTIONS OF THE SITE SHALL BE STABILIZED (TEMPORARILY OR PERMANENTLY SEEDED, MULCHED, SODDED OR PAVED) AS SOON AS PRACTICABLE, BUT IN NO CASE MORE THAN 7 CALENDAR DAYS AFTER THE CONSTRUCTION ACTIVITY IN THAT PORTION OF THE SITE HAS TEMPORARILY OR PERMANENTLY
- 13. UNTIL SUCH TIME AS THE PROJECT SITE REACHES FINAL STABILIZATION AND A NOTICE OF TERMINATION IS FILED BY THE OWNER, THE CONTRACTOR SHALL BE RESPONSIBLE TO ADJUST, REPAIR, OR REPLACE, ALL VEGETATION, EROSION CONTROLS, SEDIMENT CONTROLS, AND ANY OTHER PROTECTIVE MEASURES AS REQUIRED IN ORDER TO MAINTAIN THEIR INTENDED
- 14. EXCEPT FOR FLOWS FROM FIRE FIGHTING ACTIVITIES. SOURCES OF NON-STORM WATER EXPECTED DURING THE CONSTRUCTION PROCESS THAT MAY BE COMBINED WITH STORM WATER DISCHARGES ARE IDENTIFIED IN THE SWPPP. THESE DISCHARGES SHALL BE DIRECTED AWAY FROM UNPROTECTED, BARE, OR OTHERWISE UNSTABILIZED SOIL, AND APPROPRIATE POLLUTION PREVENTION MEASURES SHALL BE IMPLEMENTED SO THAT THESE DISCHARGES DO NOT CAUSE EROSION OR DEGRADE THE QUALITY OF RUNOFF FROM THE CONSTRUCTION SITE.

- 19. EROSION CONTROL BLANKET SHALL BE OF NORTH AMERICAN GREEN DS75 OR APPROVED EQUAL
- 20. A TEMPORARY CONCRETE WASHOUT FACILITY SHALL BE CONSTRUCTED AT A LOCATION APPROVED BY THE ENGINEER. WASHOUT FACILITY SHALL BE UTILIZED FOR ALL APPLICABLE OPERATIONS.

EROSION CONTROL NOTES

- 21. STABILIZED CONSTRUCTION ENTRANCES SHALL BE INSTALLED, TO THE DIMENSIONS AS SHOWN, AT APPROVED LOCATIONS FOR THIS PROJECT. ALL CONSTRUCTION TRAFFIC MUST UTILIZE THE STABILIZED CONSTRUCTION ENTRANCES WHEN EXITING THE SITE. ALL COST FOR EROSION CONTROL AND RESTORATION WORK ASSOCIATED WITH THE APPROVED STABILIZED CONSTRUCTION ENTRANCES SHALL BE CONSIDERED INCIDENTAL TO THE CONTRACT.
- 22. TEMPORARY EROSION CONTROL MEASURES INCLUDE TEMPORARY DITCH CHECKS, PERIMETER EROSION BARRIER, INLET AND PIPE PROTECTION, TEMPORARY SEEDING, AND ANY OTHER TEMPORARY EROSION CONTROL MEASURE NEEDED TO LIMIT THE AMOUNT OF SOIL EROSION AND SEDIMENTATION DURING CONSTRUCTION.
- 23. AT THE COMPLETION OF THE PROJECT, ALL TEMPORARY EROSION CONTROL ITEMS SHALL BE REMOVED FROM THE SITE, AND BECOME THE PROPERTY OF THE CONTRACTOR. CONTRACTOR MUST STABILIZE ANY AREA DISTURBED BY THE REMOVAL OF EROSION CONTROL ITEMS.
- 24. CONTRACTOR SHALL CLEAN ANY DEBRIS TRACKED OFFSITE DAILY.

SEEDING OF DISTURBED AREAS

- 1. THE FINAL TOP 6" INCHES OF SOIL IN ANY DISTURBANCE AREA MUST BE A COHESIVE SOIL CAPABLE OF SUPPORTING
- 2. FERTILIZER HAVING AN ANALYSIS OF 10-10-10 SHALL BE APPLIED AT A RATE OF 90 LBS/ACRE TO ALL AREAS INDICATED
- 3. THE CONTRACTOR SHALL SEED AND MULCH ALL DISTURBED AREAS ADJACENT TO IMPROVEMENTS WITH SEEDING (SEE PLANS) AND MULCH, IN ACCORDANCE WITH IDOT STANDARD SPECIFICATION OR AS APPROVED BY THE ENGINEER.
- 4. GUARANTEE: ALL SEEDED AREAS SHALL BE MAINTAINED AND MOWED FOR AT LEAST 30 DAYS AFTER GERMINATION SCATTERED BARE SPOTS NO LARGER THAN TWO SQUARE FOOT WILL BE ALLOWED UP TO A MAXIMUM OF 5% OF ANY SEEDED AREA INCLUDING 30-DAY MAINTENANCE, MOWING AND WATERING AS NECESSARY.
- 5. THIS WORK SHALL CONFORM TO THE APPLICABLE STANDARDS FROM THE ILLINOIS URBAN MANUAL, THE ILLINOIS DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION STANDARD SPECIFICATION SECTIONS, CURRENT EDITION, THE PROJECT SPECIFICATIONS, AND THE
- 6. RESTORATION THE CONTRACTOR SHALL RESTORE ALL AREAS DISTURBED DURING CONSTRUCTION OF THE IMPROVEMENTS AND RELATED APPURTENANCES OR AS PART OF ANY OF THEIR ACTIVITIES TO A CONDITION EQUAL TO OR BETTER THAN THE ORIGINAL CONDITION.

THE LOCATION OF EXISTING UTILITIES AS SHOWN ON THE DRAWINGS REPRESENT DATA RECEIVED FROM VARIOUS SOURCES. IT IS NOT GUARANTEED TO BE CORRECT OR ALL-INCLUSIVE. ADA Transition Plan

Environmental Programs Division

Interpretive Panel Translations: The Environmental Program Manager continues to work with the Graphic Designer and part-time translators to make sure that all new interpretive panel text is translated into Spanish, and that the Spanish version of each new sign is available online through a QR code printed on the physical panel.

FRESH Crew: The Environmental Education Coordinator coordinates FRESH Crew, a free volunteer opportunity open to teens every Tuesday morning from 9-11am for nine weeks in the summer. Teens assist with invasive plant removal, planting native plants, community garden maintenance, harvesting, trash clean-ups and more. We provide T-shirts, tools and instruction. This is a great opportunity for teens to spend time outdoors, get involved in the community, a n d gain new skills, experiences and professional references! Participation typically ranges from 5-12 teens per program date.

Fishing and Hiking with Freedom School: The Education and Public Programs Coordinators worked alongside the Outreach & Wellness Coordinator to provide a fishing clinic and hike around Crystal Lake Park for Freedom School, an alternative school at USD 116. The students caught many fish including bluegill, crappie, and a catfish! They were very engaged and excited. In an effort to continue providing positive experiences outdoors, Freedom School students are scheduled to come one a month in the fall to the Anita Purves Nature Center Fire Ring to learn and practice campfire safety and to enjoy time outside.

UNCC Garden Outreach: The Environmental Education Coordinator assisted the Outreach & Wellness division by providing garden-themed activities with students from the Urbana Neighborhood Connections Center (UNCC) in the garden at their center on Friday, July 28.

The Blair Park Pavilion was constructed in the 1950s and in that time has served generations of Urbana citizens, including the Reichard Family. Because of the fond memories they hold of Blair Park, along with the recent Phase I renovation that added amenities such as a new playground, challenge course, and multi-use perimeter path (among many others), the Reichard Family approached the district and the Urbana Parks Foundation about making a significant gift to assist with the renovation of the pavilion at Blair Park. They have been enthused by the revitalization of the park, and hope that their gift will allow the park and pavilion to continue to serve families in Urbana.

This is a unique opportunity where a single family can serve as a significant source of our local match funds for an OSLAD grant application for Phase II renovations to Blair Park which include the pavilion rehabilitation among many other new amenities complementary to the Phase I revitalization of the park. Given the scope of the proposed gift agreement, it is necessary for the Board of Commissioners to review, discuss, and approve acceptance of the gift. Staff recommend approval of the gift agreement with the Reichard Family for Blair Park.

GIFT AGREEMENT Between The Reichard Family and The Urbana Parks Foundation

This Gift Agreement (the "Agreement") is made this day of	by
and among D. Scott Reichard of 2835 East Stone Creek Boulevard, Urbana, Illinois, Jor	1
Reichard of 2705 River Birch Lane, Urbana, Illinois, and D. Nathan Reichard of 401 N	Wabash
Avenue #65D Chicago, Illinois (hereinafter referred to as "the Donors"), and the Urbana	a Parks
Foundation, a not-for-profit corporation in the State of Illinois (hereinafter referred to as	s "the
Foundation").	

The Donors and the Foundation agree as follows:

- 1. Donor Commitment. The Donors hereby pledge to the Foundation the sum of two hundred thousand dollars (\$200,000) to act as a local donor match for an Illinois Department of Natural Resources Open Space Land Acquisition and Development Grant application for development of Blair Park in Urbana, Illinois. In the event the grant is not awarded to the Urbana Park District, or a grant contract is unable to be executed by either the Illinois Department of Natural Resources or the Urbana Park District, the Donors shall be released from their pledge.
- 2. DONOR PURPOSE. It is understood and agreed that, subject to the provisions of clause # 3 below, the gift will be used for the following purpose or purposes: the renovation of the pavilion and other improvements located at Blair Park for which the grant is awarded.
- 3. RELATED EXPENSES. It is understood and agreed that the Foundation will retain one thousand dollars (\$1000) -- for the unrestricted general operating funds of the Foundation in order to help defray its operating expenses.
- 4. PAYMENT AND INVESTMENT. It is understood and agreed that the \$200,000 gift will be paid in full on or before December 31, 2026, with cumulative payments totaling a minimum of \$100,000 by March 31, 2025, and the balance due by December 31, 2026.

It is understood that the Reichard family has ownership in A&R Mechanical Contractors, Inc. (A&R) and agreed that A&R may reduce the cost of the project by reducing the scope of work that needs contracted through an in-kind service donation of restroom plumbing construction services. This in-kind donation is estimated at a value of \$28,000 and will reduce the cost of work needed to be funded by donor cash contributions and grant funds.

Any remaining set aside construction contingency funds that are not needed for project completion and that remain unspent at the end of the project will reduce the local match (donor) portion of the project by 50% and the state (grant) portion of the project by 50%

of the unspent contingency. Changes to the local match (donor) portion of the project will be reflected in addenda to this gift agreement.

It is further understood and agreed that the gift funds as received may be invested by the Foundation pending distribution for the purpose or purposes described herein.

- 5. NAMING/APPROVALS. In consideration of the proposed gift, it is the wish of the Donors that the pavilion at Blair Park be named the Reichard Cabin. The specific manner of onsite donor recognition at or near the pavilion will be provided by the Urbana Park District and will be jointly planned and designed with the Donors.
- 6. RECOGNITION BY THE FOUNDATION. To honor the Donors, and to express the appreciation of the Foundation for the gift, and with the permission of the Donors, publicity in the form of news announcements, both internal and external, will be made.
- 7. REPORTING AND STEWARDSHIP. Once the gift has been fully paid by the Donors and transferred by the Foundation to the Urbana Park District for the purpose specified in this Agreement, the Foundation will normally report at least one time (except as the Donors and the Foundation may otherwise mutually agree in writing) on the outcome of the gift.
- 8. FUTURE CHANGED CIRCUMSTANCES. If, in the opinion of the Foundation and the Donors, all or part of this gift cannot at some time in the future be usefully or practically applied to the above purposes or if the purposes cannot be reasonably achieved because of a future change in law or unforeseeable circumstances, it will be returned to the Donors
- 9. AMENDMENT. By mutual consent of the Foundation and the Donors (including in the event any individual Donor is deceased or otherwise unavailable the Donor's legally or duly appointed agent or attorney-in-fact, or the personal representative of the Donor's estate), any provision of this Agreement may be amended, modified, or deleted. Any such changes, deletions or additions shall be memorialized in written signed addenda, which shall form part of this Agreement.
- 10. ENTIRE AGREEMENT. This Agreement contains the entire understanding of the parties with respect to the Donors' gift contemplated in this Agreement and is governed by the laws of the State of Illinois. This Agreement also supersedes any and all prior agreements and understandings, both oral and written, between the parties relating to the the Donors' gift.
- 11. INTENT. This gift and any unpaid promised installment under this Agreement shall constitute the Donors' binding obligation and shall be enforceable at law and equity including, without limitation, against the Donors and the Donors' estates, heirs and personal representatives, and their successors and assigns.

I. Statement of Situation

The Open Space Lands Acquisition and Development (OSLAD) grant, through the Illinois Department of Natural Resources (IDNR), is open for applications through August 31, 2023. The grant purpose outlines funding assistance for land acquisition and/or development projects for public outdoor recreation purposes. District staff are pursuing the grant for Blair Park. The Blair Park Revitalization Phase II Project includes the rehabilitation of the pavilion, construction of a multipurpose t-ball and soccer field, concrete game tables, accessible baggo sets, non-verbal communication board, and picnic tables.

II. Statement of work

As with previous OSLAD projects, IDNR grant administrators recommend a variety of recreational amenities and robust community engagement for the strongest application. Blair Park was acquired in 1944 with the pavilion being constructed in 1954. Our most recent renovation was in 1993 and that was focused primarily on the restrooms attached to the pavilion. This pavilion has served generations of families throughout the years and is overdue for a renovation, so that it may keep serving our residents well. From our recent Urbana Park District Advisory Committee meeting, we created a survey on what amenities residents would like to see at Blair Park that would complement the pavilion renovation. We were able to get valuable feedback that helped us decide on our final selection of amenities. We have also gathered data by just being able to observe Blair Park and view the way people interact within this space.

The grant application includes a wonderful diversity of amenities that complement the previous OSLAD grant amenities and tennis/pickleball upgrades which include:

- Pavilion Rehabilitation
- Multipurpose T-ball and Soccer Field (1)
- Concrete Game Board Tables (2)
- Accessible Baggo Sets (2)
- Non-verbal Communication Board (1)
- Picnic Tables (4)
- Demolition, Site Work, and Paving
- Design and Engineering Fees

III. Budget

The OSLAD funding request will be \$271,000. The local match of \$271,000 is from private donations and Urbana Park District capital funds, which are covering architectural and engineering design costs.

IV. Recommendation

Staff recommend that the Board approve Resolution 2023-10 for the OSLAD Grant application for the Blair Park Revitalization Phase II Project.
