
# Athletics – May 23-October 23

- Sports Camp 392 participants in our 10 one-week sessions of Sports Camp; visited the pool, a few parks, and Skateland
- Archery Filled all 3 sessions of this program, capping at 14 participants
- Kickball –10 Kickball teams in the Summer, and had 6 participating this Fall after not having the program last fall
- Pony Baseball 5 Pony League teams; Tuscola took home the Championship at Ambucs Park; Travel Ball continues to make it hard for us and the small towns to field teams
- Fall & Spring Outdoor Youth Soccer Really great turnout this Spring for Soccer. We had 76 participants in Sharkies. We also had 281 participants in 1<sup>st</sup>-8<sup>th</sup> grade which was well over the 227 total athletes in the previous season. This fall we had 56 Sharkies, and 161 in 1st -8th graders.
- Fall HS Baseball Served 89 H.S. area baseball players with games in Urbana and Champaign. We had players from 16 different High Schools.
- Adult Co-Rec Volleyball 5 teams this fall. The winter season is going to be 2 short seasons as the gym will be closed Feb 7-March 20.
- Pre Season Shooters Basketball –21 participants this season working on drills and playing scrimmage games to get sharp before the season.
- Indoor Soccer –64 registered participants in our Wed. and Sun. Fall program learning skills through drills and scrimmage.



## Athletics - Soon

- Youth Basketball Will begin in January. The gym will be closed for 5 of our 6 normal game weeks. Hoping to work with the schools to have a game location.
- Pickleball We had 860 individual visits for Pickleball from Jan-Apr before we closed for the summer. Outdoor usage at Blair Park is daily. They will be coming back inside soon as it continues to get colder.
- Gym & Field Rental Revenue We have brought in roughly \$9,441.00 in Gym Rental revenue May23-Oct 23. \$5,510.00 in Field Rental Revenue to date.
